This checklist contains all species observed on the Seatuck LI Birding Challenge, 2014-2021. Codes describe status over a relatively broad period of fall migration. **Bold font** indicates species that are difficult to identify, or expected to be scarce on the date of this year's Seatuck Challenge. Reports of these will be reviewed for acceptance, so we encourage details or documentation in these cases, and of course for any species that would be new to the Challenge.

COMMON (C): Found in moderate to large numbers, and usually easy to find in appropriate habitat.

UNCOMMON (U): Found in small numbers, and usually—but not always—found with some effort in appropriate habitat.

RARE (R): Occurs annually in very small numbers, OR not to be expected on any given day, but may be found with extended effort in appropriate habitat at this time of year.

IRREGULAR (I): Represents an irruptive species whose numbers are highly variable from year to year. There may be small to large numbers present in one year, while in another year it may be absent altogether.

\* Naturally reproducing populations are rare on Long Island and may be restricted to eastern Suffolk County.
