**Seatuck** is a unique organization with ambitious goals. Our commitment to conserving Long Island's wildlife requires us to consider wildlife populations and environmental conditions across the entire island. We remain focused on the big picture, working to conserve and connect habitats, advance biodiversity and restore ecological health on a regional scale, across all of Long Island.

## Seatuck Is Actively

- Conserving horseshoe crabs, diamondback terrapins, and other iconic Long Island species by restoring coastal habitats, reducing human impacts and advancing science-based wildlife protection.
- Monitoring river otters as they recolonize Long Island and working to reduce roadway risks and other challenges they face in a developed landscape.
- Protecting nesting sites for terns and other seabirds by stewarding vulnerable beaches and preparing for accelerating sea-level rise and habitat loss.
- Restoring Long Island's rivers and streams by addressing dams and undersized culverts that block the movement of migratory fish and other wildlife, as well as sediments and nutrients.
- Advocating to keep the Nissequogue River free flowing—urging Suffolk County not to rebuild the Stump Pond Dam to protect taxpayer dollars and support a healthier, more resilient river. [#LetTheNissequogueRiverRun](#)
- Connecting Long Islanders of all ages to nature through hands-on programs, field experiences and community-science initiatives that build ecological awareness.
- Introducing students to Long Island's estuaries and inspiring future environmental stewards through oyster-growing projects and educational programs about the ecology of the Great South Bay.

## Engagement Opportunities

**Conservation Breakfast (January):** Gather to discuss current projects as well as the state of Long Island's environment with Seatuck staff and local leaders. **The Long Island Natural History Conference (February):** This annual conference is the largest regional forum for the exchange of information pertaining to Long Island's natural history.
